KENYA

Home to some of the most iconic national parks and reserves in Africa, the most famous of which is the Masai Mara. Beyond the Masai Mara there are several other notable areas for game viewing: The Laikipia Plateau & Mount Kenya, just to the north of Nairobi. Amboseli to the south, with Meru National Park. Samburu Reserve and the Lake District. Each has distinct topography and endemic flora and fauna, all are worth a visit.

As well as the game viewing, Kenya is also renowned for its beautiful beach resorts where the warm waters of the Indian Ocean lap the 300 mile coastline of glorious palm fringed white sandy beaches.

BEST TIME TO GO

June to October is considered high season as there's virtually no rain and daytime temperatures are not too hot. The weather is at its best in these dry months. Wildlife congregates around water sources, and there is an air of anticipation for the arrival of the Great Migration's mega-herds into the Masai Mara. However, with a diverse geography and a moderate climate, Kenya is considered a great year-round safari and beach holiday destination.

Classic Kenya

DAY 1 Arrive in Nairobi. Drive across the Great Rift Valley to the Masai Mara. Enjoy an afternoon game viewing before transferring to your safari lodge for 2 nights.

DAY 2 Enjoy a full day of game viewing in the Masai Mara. Elephants and buffalo can be found in the riverine forests, with impala and Thompson's gazelle on the grasslands together with lion, cheetah, hyena and jackal.

DAY 3 Return to the Rift Valley and on to Lake Naivasha. Take an afternoon boat trip on the lake which is one of the prime bird watching areas in East Africa. Stay at a lakeside lodge.

DAY 4 Drive to Amboseli, crossing the Athi plains, home of the colourful Masai tribes. Stay 2 nights at a lodge in Amboseli.

DAY 5 Enjoy morning and afternoon game drives in Amboseli with lush water holes. open plains, and acacia woodlands. Spot lions, leopards, cheetahs, elephants, and game, all with Mt. Kilimanjaro as a stunning backdrop.

DAY 6 After an early breakfast, enjoy your final views of Mount Kilimanjaro before departing Amboseli. Travel north across the Athi Plains to Nairobi, then transfer to the airport for your flight to Mombasa.

DAY 7-10 Enjoy three vibrant days in Mombasa, enjoying Swahili culture at Fort Jesus, relaxing on Diani's beaches, savouring local delicacies, and exploring bustling markets for a delightful coastal adventure.

INDIA

March and April are especially rewarding, as rising temperatures draw wildlife to water sources, increasing sightings in the dry, open terrain of the Indian jungle.

Land of Tiger

DAY 1-4 Arrive in Kanha, one of India's top tiger reserves, known for its thriving Bengal tiger population. After settling in, enjoy your first game drive in search of these majestic predators. Over the next two days, embark on early morning and afternoon safaris, exploring the vast landscapes, dense forests, and meadows. The park is home to tigers, leopards, wild boar, and a diverse range of bird species. For a deeper cultural experience, visit local Gond and Baiga tribes, offering a glimpse into rural Indian life.

DAY 5-6 Next, head to Bandhavgarh, famed for having one of the highest tiger densities in India. Enjoy thrilling game drives through its dense forests and open meadows. With its rich biodiversity, including tigers, sloth bears, and various wildlife, Bandhavgarh offers excellent opportunities for tiger sightings. 

DAYS 2-4 There's much to explore in this beautiful city of Cape Town. Table Mountain is a must and we are sure you'll want to explore the shops, arts and crafts, entertainment and food halls at the V&: A Waterfront

DAYS 5-6 We will arrange for a car to be delivered to your hotel, then set off for a couple of nights in the Winelands. Franschhoek is a picturesque village and a popular place to stay. Stellenbosch is worth exploring and there are numerous wine estates to stop off at en-route.

DAYS 7-8 It's a scenic drive across the Franschhoek Pass through Robertson and Montagu to Oudtshoorn for a 2 night stay. This little town is famous for its ostrich farms and the Cango Caves are spectacular.


DAYS 9-11 Cross the Outeniqua Pass and head to the coast for your drive along the famed Garden Route

DAYS 12-14 Drive to your safari lodge located in the Eastern Cape, for a wonderful 3 days on safari in your private concession.



The best months are usually January to early March and June through to December. In November it's the turn of the 'short rains' so expect short, sharp bursts of rain which, in our experience, are not enough to spoil the game viewing, and the dramatic skies make a great backdrop. On the islands, the best weather is from July to October when you can expect hot, sunny days and little rainfall.

Tanzania

Days 1 Arrive in Arusha for an overnight stay.

Days 2-3 Relax in the morning, then meet your guide and drive to Ngorongoro for a 2-night stay in Karatu. Spend a day in the Ngorongoro Crater, enjoying views from the rim before descending for a day of game viewing and a picnic lunch amid diverse scenery and abundant wildlife

Days 4-5 Travel to Serengeti National Park for 2 nights. Depending on the season, you might witness the Great Migration, but the Serengeti offers impressive game viewing year-round.

Day 6 Continue to Lake Manyara for an overnight stay. The park features an alkaline lake attracting flamingos and the famous tree-climbing lions.

Day 7 Drive to Tarangire National Park for an afternoon of game viewing, known for its baobab trees and large elephant herds, especially in the dry season.

Days 8-12 Return to Arusha, where the tour ends. Fly to Zanzibar for a relaxing beach stay, enjoying watersports, cultural tours, and the charm of Stone Town.



BEST TIME TO GO

To see the Delta at its watery finest, we recommend visiting between June and October, though as the amount of water in the Delta depends on rainfall in Angola in the preceding months, this can be a moveable feast. Days at this time of year should be hot and dry. This is also the best time to visit Chobe as the lack of rain brings the migrating wildlife down to the river.

Luxury Rotswana

Days 1 Arrive in Victoria Falls and transfer to your chosen hotel or riverside lodge for a stay of 2 nights.

DAY 2 At leisure to enjoy the hugely impressive Falls. Whether you're viewing the Falls on foot or from a helicopter, there are incredible photo opportunities. We recommend a sunset cocktail cruise on the 7ambezi.

DAYS 3-5 Transfer by road into Botswana or take a short flight to Kasane Airport for the flight to Savuti, a game-rich area in the western corner of Chobe National Park. Stay 3 nights and enjoy 2 full days of game drives.

DAYS 6-7 Fly into the Delta for a 2 night stay at a water camp. There are several to choose from and we can recommend a camp to suit you. They all offer activities based on the water - gentle mokoro rides through the reeds and game viewing by boat. Look out for wildlife often seen in this area, such as the Red Lechwe and Sitatunga antelopes.

DAYS 8-10 To complete the Delta experience, we recommend you finish with 3 nights at a land camp for thrilling game drives on open safari vehicles.

Clear skies and calm seas make it perfect for outdoor adventures, cultural tours, and enjoying the island's stunning natural beauty at its finest.



The weather is pleasant with clear skies, making it perfect for exploring the dunes of Sossusvlei and enjoying outdoor activities in Swakopmund.

Rest of Lamibia

Days 1-2 Begin your journey in Windhoek with an experienced guide, travelling through the Khomas Hochland highlands to the Namib Desert. Stay at Dead Valley Lodge for 2 nights, exploring the desert's apricot-coloured dunes, white clay pans, and Sesriem Canyon.

Days 3-4 Drive through the Gaub and Kuiseb canyons to the coast at Walvis Bay. Stay at The Delight in Swakopmund for 2 nights, enjoying its German influences. Spot seals and dolphins on a guided sea kayaking trip, with additional activities available

Davs 5-6 Head north to Damaraland's dramatic rock formations and wilderness. See Twyfelfontein's prehistoric rock engravings and embark on a 4x4 adventure to find desert-adapted elephants. Stay 2 nights at Camp Kipwe.

& UGANDA

Rwanda and Uganda are two of only three places on earth where you can see the endangered mountain gorillas in their natural habitat. Your trek observing the gorillas is fascinating and rewarding but will probably leave you wanting more, which is why we recommend a second trek. Gorilla trekking permits are strictly limited so we will need to plan in advance.

Both countries are also home to healthy populations of chimpanzees. Beyond the primates, there are wildlife parks, lakes, mountains, forests, rivers and incredibly beautiful scenery.

BEST TIME TO GO

Gorilla and chimpanzee trekking are year round activities, however we recommend you plan your visit during the two dry seasons from June to September and again from mid-December to February. We suggest you avoid March to May if you can, the rains are heavy and persistent and the treks can be steep and muddy. Game viewing in the parks is best during the dry seasons, particularly towards the end of the seasons. November to April is great for birdwatching.

Hidden Uganda

DAY 1 Arrive in Entebbe for an overnight stay.

Days 2-3 Travel by road to Murchison Falls National Park with your driver-guide. En-route, enjoy a guided walk at Ziwa Rhino Sanctuary. Stay 2 nights in the park, where you'll take a game drive along the Nile River, spotting lions, buffalo, elephants, and Rothschild giraffes. Continue game viewing on a boat cruise to the bottom of Murchison Falls.

Days 4-5 Drive to Kibale Forest Reserve for a 2 night stay. You'll embark on a thrilling trek to see chimpanzees in Kibale Forest, along with other primates during your strenuous walk.

Days 6-7 After lunch, leave Kibale for Queen Elizabeth National Park, staying 2 nights. Enjoy game drives and a boat cruise on the Kazinga Channel, spotting elephants, hippos, Nile crocodiles, and diverse birdlife.

Days 8-10 Conclude with a visit to Bwindi Impenetrable Forest to see mountain gorillas. The trek is steep and strenuous, but your time spent with the gorillas is unforgettable. During your 3 night stay, you can also enjoy forest walks, bird watching, or a cultural visit to the Batwa tribe

Day 11 Fly back to Entebbe to continue your holiday or return home. This sample itinerary can be personalised to your requirements. Book early for gorilla permits.
